Unit number and title: Unit 9 – Using Ratios and Proportions

Short Description: This activity has the students using ratios and proportions to assist them in creating a scale drawing of a room. The students need to be able to use tools to measure and calculate area of the room. Also to determine ratio between width and length of the room and how to use this ratio to create the scaled drawing that is in proportion to the actual room.

TEACHER: Teacher Prep/Lesson Plan

Lab Objective

Students are able to measure a room and determine the following:

Area of the room

Ratio of width to length

Draw a scaled drawing of the room

Student can take measurements and record the measurements

STUDENT INSTRUCTIONS:

• Statement of problem addressed by lab

You are to measure the classroom to create a scaled (1:20) drawing of the room. You will also determine the ratio between length and width of the room.

Grouping instructions and roles

The class will be divided into groups of 3 students by the teacher.

Each group will have the following roles:

Holder of end of tape

Reader of measurement

Recorder of measurements

• **Procedures** – steps to follow/instructions

- 1. Collect a tape measure from teacher
- 2. Start at one corner of the room and measure the length of the wall
- 3. Record the measurement
- 4. Measure the next wall as you go around the room
- 5. Record the measurement

Outcome instructions

- 1. After the measurements have been recorded, the group gets together to calculate the area of the room
- 2. Group determines the ratio of the length to the width of the room
- 3. Group uses the ratio to draw a plan of the room that is proportional (1:20 scale)
